

Poster presentations are strongly recommended, in addition to oral presentations.

While many of you may feel that an oral presentation is the best way to showcase your research because it allows the audience to directly hear and understand your findings, LOC strongly encourages poster presentations at the ISAR-8. Poster sessions offer unique advantages that can enhance both the communication of your research and your opportunities for interactions with other participants. As outlined below, poster presentations provide significant benefits, and we highly recommend that you consider this option while sharing your work.

1. Networking opportunities

- One-on-one dialogue is possible during poster sessions → Detailed explanations can be given according to the interests of the other party.
- Flexible adjustment of explanations based on the background of the other party → Easy to deepen the understanding of the audience.
- Networking opportunities with researchers in the same research field → Possibility lead to collaborative research.

2. Receive detailed feedback

- Time is limited for oral presentation -> You have relatively more time during poster presentation to explain your research in detail.
- Great opportunity to receive specific advice that will lead to improvement and advance your research.

3. Less stressful and more flexible presentation

- Oral presentations require strong presentation skills, as you need to deliver your talk precisely within a limited time.
- Poster presentations allow you to explain at your own pace, making it easier to present in a relaxed manner.

4. Visual and interactive presentations

- Graphs and diagrams can be used effectively, allowing you to convey information more visually than slides in an oral presentation.
- You can directly point to specific data or figures as you explain, enhancing audience understanding.

5. Reach a larger audience

- Oral presentations are limited to the audience present during your session. Poster presentations can be viewed freely by many participants throughout the session.
- Posters remain on display even when you are not present, allowing more people to see your research.

6. Suitable for preliminary or highly specialized research

- For early-stage research, poster presentations are a useful way to get feedback and help set the direction for future work.
- For highly specialized topics, poster session makes it easier to connect with interested researchers and have more in-depth discussions.

7. Easy to discuss after the presentation

- In oral presentations, Q&A time is short because the next presenter follows immediately.
- In poster presentations, there is no strict time, allowing for longer, more detailed discussions.
